Here's what we believe:

Paraphrased from the Statement of Faith of the World Evangelical Alliance.*

- **Scripture**  Given by God, divinely breathed; never wrong, always trustworthy, top authority
- **God**  Always has been, always will be; one substance, three people: Father, Son and Holy Spirit
- **Jesus**  God in the flesh, born of a virgin, perfect-living, miracle-making; died in our place, came back to life, went back upstairs, pleads for our sake, coming again
- **Salvation**  All are lost, all do wrong; saved only by the sacrifice of Jesus, by faith in him, not by doing good ourselves
- **Holy Spirit**  Lives in believers, gives new life, gives us power to talk about Jesus and do what he wants
- **Unity**  All real Jesus-believers made one in the Spirit as part of his Body on earth, the universal Church
- **Resurrection**  Everyone will come back to life; Jesus-believers get paradise, everyone else gets hell-horror

- ☑ Nearly 2,000 years since Jesus told us to grow his followers around the earth, over **2 billion** people have still not had the chance to hear about him.
- ☑ Nearly **60%** of Christian martyrs lost their lives in the 20th Century. Persecution is severe around the world and only set to get worse.
- ☑ Christians were **34.5%** of the world's population in 1900 and **32.4%** in 2000 – but despite shrinking horribly in the West, we have grown rapidly among the Rest.

How it Works



People give us money. Our network of investors join the Fund by donating any amount, one-off or regularly.

We invest it in diversified, ethical, global funds holding a mixture of stocks and bonds, and keep them for the long term.



Our investments gain value on average, riding out the ups and downs of the market, net of investment charges.

We find the places on earth in greatest need, based on lack of Christians, persecution, poverty and other factors.



We find the Christian organisations making the biggest difference in those places per amount of money provided.

We give those organisations money, subject to conditions to make sure they spend it in the right ways.



We measure our impact and report back to our supporters, making sure we learn from our mistakes and improve.

Key Messages

- The Church was financially unprepared for COVID-19
- When the next lean years come, will we have grain in the storehouses?
- Christian giving **doesn't match the scale of the world's needs**
- The Church needs a long-term step-change in the way its work is funded

- We'll **pass on 100% of your donation** to the best charities we can find, plus growth and minus investment charges, when you give to one of our **six targeted funds**
- We'll **consult you and keep you informed throughout**, unless you'd rather not hear from us
- Don't stop giving to charities working in the short term – but do start giving to us as well!
- We'll also **publish recommendations** of which charities make the best impact

We have six dedicated funds targeting different types of work, as well as a General Fund which can support any charitable work and pay the charity's operating expenses. Ground rules

- Only collective funds, not direct holdings
- Only ethical funds with environmental, social and governance (ESG) criteria
- Industrial and geographical diversification
- Only “passive” funds with low charges which track the markets
- Investments held long term (at least 3 years)
- Review portfolio and research any alternatives at least once a financial year

The value of our investments can go down as well as up and we may get back less than we originally invested. Past performance is not a guide to future performance and some investments need to be held for the long term.



Grant-Making



Each of the seven funds on page 20 makes its own grants, independently of the others, using its own set of measures of need and activities to support. Only charitable organisations are eligible. Evangel Fund does not accept applications for funding, instead researching and selecting its own grant recipients. The value of grants will be very small initially, increasing in line with the size of the charity's investment portfolio. The larger the grant, the more stringent will be the conditions attached to it. Final discretion rests with the Trustees. Full details are in our Grant-Making Policy.

We assess, classify and monitor risks to our work and assign actions to mitigate them.





12th August: we are registered with the Charity Commission as a new charitable incorporated organisation (CIO).



2020

12th December: we are founded as a charitable trust. We invest during market lows such as the COVID-19 crash and grow.



2019


April: inspired by a world missions event in Wales led by George Verwer, we decide to formally start a charity and start planning.



June: we make personal investments in a series of renewable energy co-operatives, with the aim of one day funding missions.

May: realising the importance of impact, we raise money for a highly effective charity in a sponsored "Prayerthon."

Weaknesses

To improve on these, we will:

- ☑ Undertake continuous training and development
- ☑ Raise our profile and build partnerships
- ☑ Use specific funds and beneficiary case studies
- ☑ Initial dependence on small number of funding sources
- ☑ Prior connections between some team members may reduce independent decision-making
- ☑ Future world disasters may mandate high grant expenditure and shorten our lifespan

To secure against these, we will:

- ☑ Undertake fundraising to find a broader base of regular donors
- ☑ Appoint a Trustee to supervise connections within the team
- ☑ Pray for the resources to continue as long as God wills
